Pakistan has witnessed many such personalities who have given a lot to the nation and its people. Those Pakistanis have surely made their name within the country.





She was the younger sister of Muhammad Ali Jinnah. She was a close associate and an adviser to her older brother.

Liaquat Ali Khan (October 1895 - October 1951), widely known as **Quaid-e-Millat** (Leader of the Nation) and **Shaheed-e-Millat** (Martyr of the Nation), was a Pakistani statesman, lawyer, political theorist, and one of the leading founding fathers of Pakistan. He was educated at Aligarh Muslim University in India, and then at Oxford University. He became the first Prime Minister of Pakistan.
