



BABAR AZAM




Babar Azam is a Pakistani international cricketer who captains Pakistan in all formats. Regarded as one of the finest batsmen in contemporary world cricket, he is currently the only batsman in the world to be in the top 5 rankings across all formats. He is ranked as the number one batsman in T20I and in ODIs. He captains Karachi Kings in the PSL and captains Central Punjab in domestic cricket. In April 2021, he achieved the number one spot in the ICC rankings for ODI batsmen while in November 2021, he became the number one T20I batsman, a ranking he previously held in 2018.




MUHAMMAD RIZWAN








Wasim Akram is a Pakistani cricket commentator, coach, and former cricketer and captain of the Pakistan national cricket team. A left-arm fast bowler who could bowl with significant pace, he is known as king of reverse swing. In October 2013, Wasim Akram was the only Pakistani cricketer to be named in an all-time Test World XI to mark the 150th anniversary of Wisden Cricketers' Almanack.










KULSOOM HAZARA

Belonging to the Hazara community in Quetta, Kulsoom Hazara is a Karate Champion in Pakistan. Having lost both of her parents as a child, Kulsoom was looked after by her brother-in-law who also introduced her to the sport at the age of five. However, as Balochistan grew less secure, the family moved to Karachi in the 1990s. Kulsoom made her mark in karate when she won three gold medals at the Sindh Games 2000 and won bronze in the national karate championship held in Lahore in 2002. In a country where female karate champions are rare, Kulsoom managed to win a gold medal at national level in 2005 and many years after that. She has also been titled the 'Icon of the Nation' for 2020 and received the 'Excellence Award' in sports in 2017. Kulsoom also has her own karate club in Lyari for other martial artists to train.



AMIR KHAN

Amir Iqbal Khan is a British professional boxer, promoter and philanthropist. He is a former unified light-welterweight world champion, having held the WBA (later Super) title from 2009 to 2012, and the IBF title in 2011. At regional level, he held the Commonwealth lightweight title from 2007 to 2008. He also held the WBC Silver welterweight title from 2014 to 2016, and once challenged for the WBC and Ring magazine middleweight titles in 2016.






SHAHEEN SHAH AFRIDI

Shaheen Shah Afridi is a Pakistani professional cricketer who plays as a fast bowler for the Pakistan national cricket team. He made his international debut for Pakistan in April 2018 and his Test match debut for the national team in December 2018.

In 2017, Afridi was noted as a fast-bowling talent who can bowl at 90 mph, and also for his batting ability. He considers himself an all-rounder and seeks to excel in bowling, batting and fielding. In August 2018, he was one of thirty-three players to be awarded a central contract for the 2018-19 season by the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB). The following year, Afridi was awarded the Sir Garfield Sobers Trophy (Cricketer of the Year). Afridi was named as the captain of the Lahore Qalandars for 2022 Pakistan Super League.





NOORENA SHAMS

Noorena is a Pakistani sportsperson who has been a cyclist, a cricketer and a squash player. She's the first ever cyclist to win a silver medal for Pakistan in the Junior Olympics. She has played different sports winning 63 gold medals, 24 silver medals and 5 bronze medals and has been among the Top 40 Asian Junior Squash Players. She is also currently ranked 209 in the world. She is regarded as the youngest South Asian to ever win a silver medal in the Junior Olympics.
